PARISH NEWS

ALAN BARKER

The Parish Council met virtually on the 11th March and the 6th May 2021. Due to the ongoing Covid 19 pandemic the Parish Council has continued to follow the Government guidance to meet remotely. In line with Government requirements the next meeting planned will take place in the Ellerker Village Hall on Thursday 8th July 2021 at 7.30pm. At the Annual Council Meeting Claire Wood was requested to undertake the post of Chairman for the next 12 months.

The Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR) for the year ending 31 March 2021 has been completed by the Parish Council. The dates set for the period of exercise of public rights commences on 14th June 2021 and ends on 23rd July 2021. During this period the Annual Governance Statement and Accounting Statements for 2020/21 will be available to view on the Parish noticeboards and the website.

The Queen Elizabeth Platinum Jubilee Celebration is scheduled to take place from Thursday, 2nd June 2022 to Sunday, 5th June 2022. The Ellerker Community groups have agreed that a village occasion should be planned for Sat 4th June 22. Further information will be available re planning later in the summer.

Claire Wood met with Jim McGivern from the ERYC Parish & Area Liaison Taskforce & Environmental Enforcement team on 27th April 2021 to agree a schedule of works to be undertaken in the village during the summer months. Work to address residents' concerns with regards to Speeding, Parking, Flooding and Verge maintenance continues along with various projects to improve the ambience of the village in the short and medium term.

The Ellerker Street lights are scheduled to be painted and renovated shortly.

Ellerker Parish Councillors and the Clerk continue to attend training events hosted by the East Riding and North Lincs Local Council Association (ERNLLCA) and ERYC to enhance the knowledge and expertise of the Parish Council team.

FLOODING

Following the November 2019 flooding and the ongoing high levels of rainfall, the Parish Council continue to seek to engage with representatives of the key authorities to reduce the risks posed by the rainfall and sewage.

- The East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) Flood & Coastal Risk Management Team have completed the Ellerker Beck dredging and repair to banks.
- The Parish Council are engaging with the West Wolds Slow the Flow group (W/WSTF). W/WSTF are considering holding public meetings to publicise the work of the group and will have a stand at the Summer Fayre.
- ERYC Highways have further projects planned in the village that are ongoing.
- Yorkshire Water have engaged a consultant (Scantec) to consider internal flooding issues, pollution and capacity of the Sewage Works. Work is continuing to improve performance in Ellerker and the wider West Wolds. Funding will be available as required.
- Ongoing concerns with regards to Water and Waste Management in Ellerker have again been reported to the Yorkshire Water Senior Management Team in April and May 2021 in response to water flowing out of the manhole covers on Main Street and Ings Lane (and into the road side ditches), discharge of final treated effluent at Norfolk Bank and concerns of residents with regards to the impact of the sewage pipe under the Church Lane bridge which continues to cause an obstruction and may contribute to flooding of the village.

- Concerns reported to the YW Senior Managers along with photographs on a significant number of occasions from Ellerker residents. All complainants advised that they must also contact Yorkshire Water directly in addition to the Parish Council for the complaint to be correctly logged.

The Parish Council, in conjunction with the planners of the East Riding of Yorkshire, are continuing to work to review the Ellerker conservation area status which was last reviewed in 1986 to give it greater effectiveness in the planning process. This in turn will allow the data produced to be used, together with specific design codes to produce a draft Neighbourhood Plan not just for the Village, but for the whole of the Parish. The Conservation Area appraisal is being considered by the ERYC Cabinet Committee on the 18th May.

The Neighbourhood Planning process gives the village an opportunity to manage change, in a sustainable manner whilst protecting our heritage. When circumstances allow, we will be holding workshops which will allow the community to meet with the consultant, speak to the planners, and see the proposals for the design codes to be produced. The views of the community will be of vital importance to the success of the project and it is crucial for the community to play their part as we know they will.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Firstly, a big thank you to our residents and our own Committee Co-ordinators for continuing to look after our residents and help each other in these ongoing difficult times. Fortunately, at our recent quarterly meeting we were able to report only a few local crimes. Anti-social behaviour has been reported with motor vehicles down Todds Lane and Sands Lane. Police have issued formal warnings to individuals and have agreed to keep an eye on things.

Police have advised that thefts of catalytic converters continue. The latest NHW Alert recommends parking your car in a locked garage where possible, but if not an option, park it in a well-lit or well-populated area. Park close to a fence, wall or kerb with the exhaust being closest to the fence, wall or kerb to make the theft more difficult. Avoid parking your vehicle half on the pavement and half on the road, as this may make it easier for thieves to access the catalytic converter.

Diesel theft is still occurring occasionally and the NHW Alert from 12/4/21 recommended the usual vigilance.

The NHW Alert also explained that the police have been receiving a number of calls in relation to illegal metal detecting (aka "Night Hawking") which had been taking place on farm land and areas of archaeological interest. The removal of any object from land without the landowner's permission is theft. Further offences are committed if damage is caused to protected architectural sites; using metal detectors on archaeological sites without a licence from Historic England; or failing to report objects found (that are potential treasure) under the Treasure Act. Night Hawkers have complete disregard for the law and experts warn that we are losing heritage of our nation. We are advised that if we witness anyone acting in a suspicious manner around protected archaeological sites, then we should contact police on 999 due to suspected crimes in action. Non-emergency incidents should be reported on 101. This is, of course, the case with all incidents but please give as much detail as possible, ie car registration numbers and full descriptions, etc. Please call the police first as they prefer to deal directly with the witness rather than via a NHW Co-ordinator.

Needless to say, scams of all types continue. **BE WARY** - do not divulge any personal information of any type to any person calling you in any way, unless you are 1000% certain with whom you are conversing. On a lighter note: All being well, and as previously notified, the NHW Quiz will take place on Friday 15 October 2021 in the Village Hall.
