### **ALLOTMENTS**

The Allotment Working Group are pleased to confirm that the wildflower meadow continues to progress well for part of the Stone Pits Field Allotment Gardens. The annual cut will be completed in late August / early September. Fruit will also be available for residents to pick shortly. There are currently 5 active tenants. #### **VILLAGE SURVEY**

The Parish Council, in conjunction with the planners of the East Riding of Yorkshire, are continuing to work to review the Ellerker conservation area status which was last reviewed in 1986 to give it greater effectiveness in the planning process. This in turn will allow the data produced to be used, together with specific design codes to produce a draft Neighbourhood Plan not just for the Village, but for the whole of the Parish. Residents are encouraged to <u>complete the</u> <u>survey</u> available via the ERYC website with a closing date of 17th August 2021.

#### **PARISH NEWS**

The Millennium Bench outside the Village Hall is to be removed and replaced with "Chatty" bench following a successful grant application to ERYC.

The Ellerker Community Groups will be working together over the coming weeks to agree the plans for the celebration of Christmas in Ellerker. A further update will be provided as soon as possible.

The Queen Elizabeth Platinum Jubilee Celebration is scheduled to take place from Thursday, 2nd June 2022 to Sunday, 5th June 2022. The Ellerker Community groups have agreed that a village occasion should be planned for Sat 4th June 22. Further information will be available re planning following the September meeting of the Parish Council.

The Great British Spring Clean / Annual Litter Pick will now take place in March 2022.

The Ellerker Street lights have been painted and renovated.

Residents are advised that they cannot be prevented from putting signs on the ERYC maintained verge but that individual residents will be culpable for any injuries or accidents.

### **TREE WORKS**

We have a wonderful assortment of mature trees on the Playing Fields which contribute to our conservation status. It is the responsibility of the Playing Fields Committee to ensure that the landscape (including trees) is maintained for the safety of those using the Playing Fields. An independent tree inspection took place last year which will be carried out again in 3 years. Most recently we had to make the decision to fell some trees that were close to residential properties/ village hall which was a great job done by The Tree Fellas (Hull). There are a few smaller ones that have since died which we need to remove. Of course, we want to ensure that we have new trees for future generations therefore if anyone would like to `sponsor' or `donate' a tree, please email

One of the things that was highlighted on our play equipment annual inspection was the lack of signage for the Playing Fields. During the pandemic, it become very apparent that visitors to the Playing Fields were unaware that these were not managed by the ERYC. We now have 3 new signs across both Playing Fields and in addition, the faded `no dogs' signs have been replaced. As the Playing Fields are in trust to the village, we encourage everyone to contribute to the upkeep, e.g. politely highlighting the no dog signs to anyone with a dog on the Playing Fields.



## **FLOODING UPDATE**

The schedule of works agreed with the ERYC Parish & Area Liaison Taskforce & Environmental Enforcement team on 27th April 2021 continues to be undertaken in the village. Work to address residents' concerns with regards to Speeding, Parking, Flooding and Verge maintenance continues along with various projects to improve the ambience of the village in the short and medium term.

Ellerker Parish Councillors and the Clerk continue to attend training events hosted by the East Riding and North Lincs Local Council Association (ERNLLCA) and ERYC to enhance the knowledge and expertise of the Parish Council team.

Following the November 2019 flooding and the ongoing high levels of rainfall, the Parish Council continue to seek to engage with representatives of the key authorities to reduce the risks posed by the rainfall and sewage.

- Riparian Owners of the Ellerker Beck are reminded of their responsibility to maintain their section of the Beck including the clearance of excess vegetation in the Beck. Riparian Owners are advised that ERYC can compel owners to complete the work (or be required to pay for any work completed by ERYC).
- The Parish Council are continuing to engage with the West Wolds Slow the Flow group (WWSTF). WWSTF are considering holding public meetings to publicise the work of the group and will have a stand at the Summer Fayre.
- ERYC Highways have ongoing projects planned in the village.
- Ongoing concerns with regards to Water and Waste Management in Ellerker have been reported to the Yorkshire Water Senior Management Team throughout 2021 in response to water flowing out of the manhole covers on Main Street and Ings Lane (and into the road side ditches), discharge of final treated effluent at Norfolk Bank and concerns of residents with regards to the impact of the sewage pipe under the Church Lane bridge which continues to cause an obstruction and may contribute to flooding of the village. Representatives from Yorkshire Water have confirmed they will be attending the September Parish Council meeting
- All complainants advised that they must also contact Yorkshire Water directly in addition to the Parish Council for the complaint to be correctly logged.
