## **PARISH COUNCIL**

The Parish Council meets Bi monthly at the Ellerker Village Hall. The next meeting will take place in the Ellerker Village Hall on Thursday 6th January 2022 at 7.30 pm. Minutes of all meetings are available to view on the <u>Ellerker</u> <u>Parish website</u>.

David Sleight was co-opted as a Councillor to Ellerker Parish Council at the September meeting. Ellerker Parish Councillors and the Clerk continue to attend training events hosted by the East Riding and North Lincs Local Council Association (ERNLLCA) and ERYC to enhance the knowledge and expertise of the Parish Council team.

The Ellerker Christmas tree will be lit on Sunday 5th December 2021 with the Christmas Tree kindly donated by Ellerker Lodge.

The Millennium Bench outside the Village Hall is to be removed and replaced with "Chatty" bench following a successful grant application to ERYC.

The Parish Council will be hosting the Annual Neighbourhood Watch Quiz on Friday 14th October 2022 at Ellerker Village Hall. Please save the date.

The Queen Elizabeth Platinum Jubilee Celebration is scheduled to take place from Thursday, 2nd June 2022 to Sunday, 5th June 2022. The Ellerker Community groups have agreed that a village occasion should be planned for Sat 4th June 22. Further information will be available re planning shortly.

The Great British Spring Clean / Annual Litter Pick will now take place in March 2022. Individuals or groups are welcome to complete litter picks independent of the Parish Council event throughout the winter months.

The schedule of works agreed with the ERYC Parish & Area Liaison Taskforce & Environmental Enforcement team on 27th April 2021 continues to be undertaken in the village. Work to address residents' concerns with regards to Speeding, Parking, Flooding and Verge maintenance continues along with various projects to improve the ambience of the village in the short and medium term.

Following the November 2019 flooding and the ongoing high levels of rainfall, the Parish Council continue to seek to engage with representatives of the key authorities to reduce the risks posed by the rainfall and sewage.

- The Parish Council are continuing to engage with the West Wolds Slow the Flow group.
- ERYC Highways have ongoing projects planned in the village.
- Gary Collins (Senior Flood Risk Manager -Yorkshire Water) attended the September meeting to provide an update and answer questions with regards to the work being completed in Ellerker Parish, along with the future mitigation plan. A further update was shared at the November meeting of the Parish Council. The update provided detailed information with regards to the drainage in Ellerker and surrounding areas, the sewage pipe under the Church Lane bridge, the Ouse Drainage Board works at Crabley Creek and the BBC Report and Wider Media communications including political and media interest in the issue of sewage spills to rivers.
- Ongoing concerns with regards to Water and Waste Management in Ellerker have been reported to the Yorkshire Water Senior Management Team throughout 2021 in response to water flowing out of the manhole covers on Main Street and Ings Lane (and into the road side ditches), discharge of final treated effluent at Norfolk Bank and concerns of residents with regards to the impact of the sewage pipe under the Church Lane bridge which continues to cause an obstruction and may contribute to flooding of the village.
- All complainants advised that they must also contact Yorkshire Water directly in addition to the Parish Council for the complaint to be correctly logged.

<u>Yorkshire Water - Report a problem</u>

The Parish Council, in conjunction with the planners of the East Riding of Yorkshire, are continuing to work to review the Ellerker conservation area status which was last reviewed in 1986 to give it greater effectiveness in the planning process. This in turn will allow the data produced to be used, together with specific design codes to produce a draft Neighbourhood Plan not just for the Village, but for the whole of the Parish. Information was available at the Parish Council stand at the Ellerker Village Summer Fayre on 4th September 2021. The updated Ellerker Conservation Area Appraisal will be formally reviewed by the ERYC Cabinet on 14th December 2021.

## **ALLOTMENTS**

The Allotment Working Group are pleased to confirm that the wildflower meadow continues to progress well for part of the Stone Pits Field Allotment Gardens. The annual cut was completed in September. Firstly, a warm welcome to two new members who have joined our watchful Team of Coordinators: Maxine Moses who joins Martin Scott in Zone A and Jo Carlile who joins Mike Barnett in Zone C. We thank you both for your support.

Our very own quiz returned to the calendar on Friday 15th October and nine teams competed, as usual amusedly and whole-heartedly, for the handsome trophy, delicious prizes and the privilege (?) of putting in the hard work for next year's event. The lucky team came from the Parish Council.

At our quarterly meeting in October, the usual concerns were raised about local crimes; specifically brought to our attention were the following subjects:

Scams: Please be aware of the serious consequences in pursuing phone calls, e-mails, visits to your door, bank messages, etcetera. Do NOT disclose information to someone you do not know or a call/e-mail you cannot identify. Do NOT press any buttons or return addresses. If necessary, terminate the call. If you require further information, we suggest you go to the following National Cyber Security Centre website: https://www.ncsc.gov.uk/

'What3words': Street addresses do not always point to precise locations, eg if you are in the middle of a golf course! 'What3words' has given every 3-metre square in the world a unique three-word address. The words are randomly assigned to each square and will always stau the same Download the 'What3words' app from your phone's App Store and signup/register – it's free. To use 'What3words' in an emergency, dial 999 and give the call handler the 'What3words' address for where assistance is needed. You find that by doing the following:

'Open the app on your phone, tap the 'locate me' icon at the bottom of the screen – it looks like an arrow on IOS devices and a compass on Android – and the three-word address of your location will be at the top of the screen, eg the address for the front door of Ellerker Village Hall is

fiction.protestor.gardens Two members of our Committee have had reason to use this app in recent times – one was able to get help in a youth hostel located in the middle of a large city and the group he was with did not have a postcode. Emergency services arrived promptly at the caller's exact room. For the less `machine-minded' like myself, more information can be found at www.what3words.com

Op Galileo' – Hare coursing and reporting: There has recently been an increase in hare coursing in the area. Please report to the police on 999 if in progress and 101 at all other times with location (see 'What3words' above!) and any vehicle details and registration and offender/ dog descriptions. If you are a member of Farmwatch please report the incident to your Farmwatch Coordinator so members are alerted.

## HAZEL MARGARET SAMPSON 28/01/32 - 26/10/21

CHRIS & PETER SAMPSON

Hazel Sampson (nee Needler) was born in Ellerker on 28th January 1932 and grew up in 'Sunnyside'. Hazel went to the village primary school, then on to St Mary's School, Hull. Hazel's desire was to become a nurse, and after leaving school at 18, she went to the Victoria Children's Hospital in Hull to start her training. In April 1953 she became a Registered Children's Nurse, and a fully qualified State Registered Nurse in July 1955, although she always preferred working with children. She won a number of nursing prizes, with photographs in the Hull Daily Mail.

After first meeting when they were 11 or 12 whilst both were holidaying with family in nearby Hotham, Hazel married Royal Air Force Sergeant Peter Sampson at St Anne's church, Ellerker on 30th June 1956. The courtship included Peter cycling 57 miles from Sheffield as a young teenager! An RAF life meant that Hazel lived in many places across the UK from Cornwall to the north of Scotland, including six years in Brough. In addition, time abroad was spent in Singapore and Malta. During all of these travels, five children arrived periodically; four sons (Nigel, Tim, Chris, Jonathan) and a daughter, Nicola.

In Hunmanby, Hazel was a stalwart of the local Riding for the Disabled Association. She was also a member of the Women's Institute and later the Mother's Union in Scotland.

Hazel lived a full, selfless and caring life, exemplified through her love and dedication to Peter, the children and grandchildren, the wider family, in her nursing career, and the wider community, wherever she was.

Hazel and Peter moved back to Elgin, Moray in 2001. Latterly, Hazel was sadly diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and spent her final few years at The Grove Care Home in Elgin. Hazel passed away peacefully on the early morning of 26th October 2021, with her family by her bedside.
