The Parish Council meets Bi monthly at the Ellerker Village Hall. The next meetings will take place in the Ellerker Village Hall on Thursday 5th May 2022. The Annual Parish Meeting will take place at 6.30pm followed by the Annual Council Meeting at 7.30pm. <u>Minutes of all meetings are available to view on the</u> Ellerker Parish website.

After 5 years, Jan Laubscher resigned from the Parish Council on 31st January 2022. Jan has been a great asset to the Parish Council being actively involved in many projects including the Conservation Area Appraisal, the development of the Allotments and the Christmas festivities. Jan will be greatly missed. The Parish Council are pleased to confirm that Philip Wood was co-opted as a Councillor for Ellerker Parish Council at the March meeting. Ellerker Parish Councillors and the Clerk continue to attend training events hosted by the East Riding and North Lincs Local Council Association (ERNLLCA) and ERYC to enhance the knowledge and expertise of the Parish Council team.

Thank you to Ellerker Lodge Garden Centre for once again donating the Christmas tree along with installing the tree and lights on the Ellerker Playing fields. The tree again looked superb this year. The lighting of the tree took place on Sunday 5th December with Mulled Wine and Mince Pies. The Beckside Singers once again led the Carol singing.

The Parish Council would like suggestions with regards to future Christmas Trees and whether a cut tree should be erected in the future or a more climate friendly / sustainable long-term solution should be sought. A full discussion will take place at the Annual Parish Meeting in May

The Millennium Bench outside the Village Hall has been removed and replaced with "Chatty" bench following a successful grant application to ERYC.

The Queen Elizabeth Platinum Jubilee Celebration is scheduled to take place from Thursday, 2nd June 2022 to Sunday, 5th June 2022. The Ellerker Community groups have agreed that a Big Jubilee Lunch party should be planned for Sunday 5th June, along with a service at St Annes Church on Friday 3rd June. The South Cave 10K will again pass through Ellerker on Sunday 31st July. It will follow the same route as before with limited road closures. The following articles and key information have been posted on the Ellerker Parish website over the past 3 months: -

East Yorkshire Buses has made a commercial decision to cease operating the 55-bus service between Elloughton and Goole after operation on Saturday 9th April 2022. Links between Elloughton and Hull will be maintained by a revised service 55. From the same date the X5 service from Goole to Hull will also cease to operate. ERYC is aware of this decision by the bus company and is currently inviting tenders for a replacement service. The replacement bus service will not be the current service 55 timetable but will provide links for the communities of South Cave, North Cave, Newport, Gilberdyke, Eastrington, Howden and Goole. ERYC plans, subject to funding, to be able to advise on a replacement timetable by Monday 14th March 2022. Clearly this will be an additional financial commitment for ERYC at a time when the budget for supported bus services is already under pressure, but ERYC will endeavour to provide a service for the residents of these villages.

The planners of the East Riding of Yorkshire advised on the 24th January 2022 that the Ellerker Conservation Area Appraisal Document and boundary amendments have been approved by the ERYC Cabinet, and are now a material consideration within the planning process. Site notices have been displayed to formally advertise the new document and boundary, the ERYC website is being updated and notifications distributed to the relevant addresses. NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

As we are all only too well aware, this month the World including our Village shortly enters its third year of 'Covid Watch'. It has been an unenviable period of our history and a very difficult time for many with illness and/or loss of life. The Committee once again says 'thank you' to all those who have watched over their neighbours and friends and/or overseen their security and well-being at a time of increasing crime rates and bad behaviour nationally. Please let us all be as aware as ever of the scams, the necessity to keep possessions locked away and the reporting of suspicious circumstances to the Police at 101- or 999 in emergency - with as much information as possible including vehicle registration plates.

Though we have been lucky enough not to have any Police reports of criminal activity this past quarter in Ellerker itself, there have been a number of incidents in the locality, particularly 'Hanoi' crimes, where houses are broken into to obtain car keys and then the car(s) stolen.

"Next Door": Some residents have received letters in the post about something called "Next Door". Because the letter is just printed on plain paper, with a code to use to sign-up, it tends to look like a scam. In fact, it is a legitimate initiative where communities come together to greet newcomers, exchange recommendations, and read the latest local news; where neighbours support local businesses and get updates from public services; and where neighbours borrow tools and sell sofas, etc. Someone who is already a member of Next Door can invite their neighbour to join. The existing member completes a form on the Next Door website and then Next Door prints and mails the invitations on the requestor's behalf, for free. The letter includes the requestor's name, street name, and information about Next Door. Of course, if you don't want to join then you simply ignore the invitation. However, it would be a good idea for people wishing to invite their neighbours to join that they ask them first rather than just arranging for the letter to be sent.

Much new legislation has been created as a result of these changing circumstances. One law that will be applicable to most residents involves changes to the Highway Code

DID YOU KNOW ... Rules for all types of road users have been updated in The Highway Code to improve the safety of people walking, cycling and riding horses. There are 8 changes that you need to know about:

- 1. Hierarchy of road users
- 2. People crossing the road at junction
- 3. Walking, cycling or riding in shared spaces
- 4. Positioning in the road when cycling
- 5. Overtaking when driving or cycling
- 6. People cycling at junctions
- 7. People cycling, riding a horse and driving horsedrawn vehicles on roundabouts.

FLOODING UPDATE

Ellerker Parish Council continue to work with East Riding of Yorkshire Council and Yorkshire Water (YW) with regards to the potential impact of flooding in Ellerker. Further updates provided by Gary Collins (Senior Flood Risk Manager, Yorkshire Water) for the January and March meetings of the Council. The reports included the following points: -

- The YW team are considering the possibilities of relaying the pipe work that passes under the Church Lane bridge as it potentially blocks the flow of the Beck in periods of flood.
- Stantec have carried out detailed desktop investigations into the whole sewer network that eventually feeds into Ellerker both through the sewer system and pump station and directly to the Sewage Treatment Works. From early desktop studies and flooding reports that have been carried out it appears to indicate that largely the foul sewer networks perform as they were designed for and factors outside this largely influence flooding / problems in the area.
- Stantec will liaise with East Riding to gain understanding on highway drainage and also deliver questionnaires to residents in Ellerker asking for them to detail they're experiences with flooding and also review pump station operational performance alongside historical rainfall data.
- YW and the Ouse and Humber Drainage Board have reached a standoff with regards to the sewage treatment works and discharge to Crabley Creek with regards to where the risk and costs lie in cleaning out the watercourse. YW are looking to set up a meeting between both parties with hopefully an independent facilitator to try and agree the way forward and future plan for managing Crabley Creek

Mike Kitching (Assistant Principal Engineer - ERYC Flood & Coastal Risk Management) provided the following update for the March meeting of the Council with regards to the works completed: _

- ERYC have installed a new headwall and concrete apron on Ings Lane at the head of the ditch.
- ERYC have installed an inspection chamber on kerb off let gullies on Main Street.
- As a goodwill gesture on a without prejudice basis, ERYC have had a contractor clear the open watercourse on Ings Lane up to the first vehicular crossing.
- As a goodwill gesture on a without prejudice basis, ERYC have had a contractor jet and clean the culvert down Ings Lane to its outfall.

- ERYC have also met with a resident who had concerns about flooding issues, plus they were also wishing to remodel their drive access. As part of this visit ERYC inspected the upstream area.
- ERYC also continue to work with the West Wolds partnership to find wider solutions to reduce the risk of flooding.

Representatives of the Parish Council are attempting to arrange a meeting with representatives from ERYC and Yorkshire Water to discuss the Culverts / Riparian Ownership and the Church Lane Bridge pipe.

• All complainants are advised that they must also contact Yorkshire Water directly in addition to the Parish Council for the complaint to be correctly logged.
